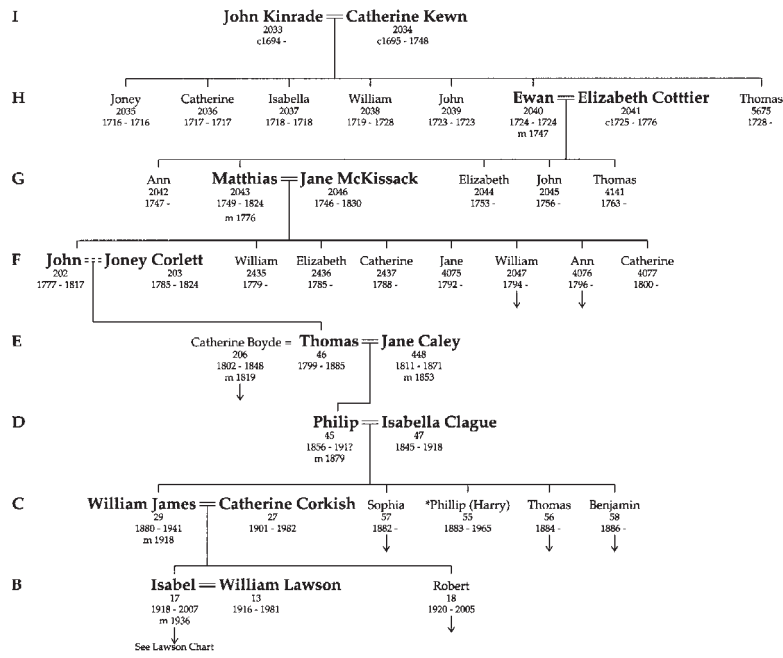

## 2.1 Origins

The name Kinrade, and its variations Kinread and Kinred, is derived from the Gaelic MacConRiada, the son of Cu Riada (Con is the genitive of Cu). Cu Riada translates as Riada's Hound. A possible alternative derivation would be from the Manks MacKinraad, son of [the dweller at the] Road's End. This second derivation is popular in folklore but is now generally considered to be somewhat fanciful.

Various spellings have been noted (the earliest date for each variation is given): Kinread 1507; MacJohnRede (where John is an error for Con), Kinrede and Kynrede 1515; Kinrade, Kinred and Kindred 1611; Kynred 1611; Kenred 1677; Kingread 1763; Kinraid 1816 and Kinrade 1873.

The name is mainly from the north of the Island being most prevalent in Lezayre and Bride with several occurrences in Ballaugh, Jurby and Andreas. On the southside, several occurrences have been noted in Marown, Douglas and Maughold. A few instances are recorded in Patrick, German and Michael on the northside and in Malew, Castletown, Santan, Braddan, Onchan and Lonan on the southside.

## 2.2 JOHN KINRADE—1694

2.2.1 John Kinrade (2033) was born circa 1694, probably in Lezayre. He married Catherine Kewin on the 27th of August, 1715, at Lezayre.

2.2.1.1 Catherine Kewin (2034) was born circa 1695, probably in Lezayre. She married John Kinrade on the 27th of August, 1715, at Lezayre.

2.3.1 Joney Kinrade (2035) was baptized on the 21st of January, 1716, at Lezayre.

2.3.2 Catherine Kinrade (2036) was baptized on the 20th of May, 1717, at Lezayre.

2.3.3 Isabella Kinrade, (2037) was baptized on the 12th of May, 1718, at Lezayre.

2.3.4 William Kinrade (2038) was baptized on the 20th of October, 1719, at Lezayre.

2.3.5 John Kinrade (2039) was baptized on the 28th of April, 1723, at Lonan.

2.3.6 Ewan Kinrade (2040) was baptized on the 21 of July, 1724, at Lezayre. He married Elizabeth Cottier on the 2nd of June, 1747, at Lezayre.

2.3.6.1 Elizabeth Cottier (2041) was born circa 1725, probably in Lezayre. She married Ewan Kinrade on the 2nd of June, 1747, at Lezayre.

- 2.4.1 Ann Kinrade (2042) was baptized on the 8th of November, 1747, at Lezayre.
- 2.4.2 Mathias Kinrade (2043) was baptized on the 27th of February, 1749, at Lezayre. He married Jane Mc Kissack on the 30th of November, 1776, at Bride.
- 2.4.2.1 Jane Mc Kissack (2046) was born circa 1750. She married Mathias Kinrade on the 30th of November, 1776, at Bride.
- 2.4.3 Elizabeth Kinrade (2044) was baptized on the 9th of December, 1753, at Lezayre.
- 2.4.4 John Kinrade (2045) was baptized on the 24th of November, 1756, at Lezayre.
- 2.4.5 Thomas Kinrade (4141) was baptized on the 27th of August, 1763, at Bride. (N.B. listed as Kingread in the I.G.I.)

- 2.5.1 John Kinrade (202) was baptized on the 2nd of March, 1777, at Bride. He left the Island in late 1798 or early 1799 when his illegitimate son, Thomas, was born. It is presumed that he went to England, but this has not yet been confirmed. At the second marriage of his son Thomas, John was described as a tailor. See Volume III, 1.5 for details of his descendants.
- 2.5.1.1 Joney Corlett (203) was born circa 1779, but she has not yet been positively identified. Her illegitimate son, Thomas Kinrade, was baptized at Kirk Andreas in March 1799. In June of that year the Church Presentments record that Joney deposed '... that John Kinread of Kirk Bride now off the Island was the father of her illegitimate child.' Joney was alive in 1819 when she gave her consent to the marriage of her underage son to Catherine Boyde.
- 2.5.2 William Kinrade (2435) was baptized on the 25th of May, 1779 at Bride.
- 2.5.3 Elizabeth Kinrade (2436) was baptized on the 9th of January, 1785, at Bride.

- 2.5.4 Catherine Kinrade (2437) was baptized on the 12th of May, 1788, at Bride. She did not survive infancy.
- 2.5.5 Jane Kinrade (4075) was baptized on the 17th of January, 1792, at Bride.
- 2.5.6 William Kinrade (2047) was baptized on the 23rd of November, 1794,, at Bride. A mason by trade, he married Margaret Wade (see Volume III, 1.4.6.1) on the 8th of November, 1817, at Bride. In 1841 he was living at Ballaben, Bride, with his wife and family. See Volume III, 1.24 for details of his descendants. The family does not appear in the 1851 census but may have been living in Liverpool.
- 2.5.7 Catherine Kinrade (4077) was baptized on the 5th of March, 1800, at Bride. She appears to have been a twin. In 1841 she was living, unmarried, with the family of Patrick Crellin at Knockbrech, German, and employed. in 1851 she appears to be living as a house servant with the family of Hugh Fargher at Bollagh, German. In 1861 she was living with John Faragher at Bllacha, German.

## 2.6 The Children of John Kinrade & Joney Corlett

- 2.6.1 Thomas Kinrade (46) was born, most probably, in February or March of 1799. We know that it was before the 6th of March, 1799, when he was baptized at Andreas, and that he was not yet twenty-one years of age when he married on the 13th of May, 1819, and so must have been born after the 13th of May, 1798. He appears in the five census of 1841-81 when his age is given as 40-44, 55, 64, 76 and 85 respectively. At his second marriage in October, 1853, his age is given as forty-four though he was actually fifty-four. At his death in October, 1885, his age is given as ninety years. Given the standards of literacy and numeracy of the times, these variations in age are not unusual.

As a young man he worked as a farm labourer. He married Catherine Boyde on 13th of May, 1819, at Andreas Church. Thomas married with permission of his mother, Joney, as he was underage. Ten children of this marriage have been located, see Volume III, 1.6.

The census of 1841 shows him living at Balla Shaane, Andreas, with his children Catherine, James, Thomas and Margaret. His wife and eldest son seem to be living at the farm of William Cleator, see 1.5.2 below. His age is given as 40 years, i.e. 40-44, and his occupation as "agricultural labourer". He was still working as an agricultural labourer at Andreas at the census in 1851.

After the death of his first wife, Catherine, Thomas moved to Lonan where he worked in the mines and married his second wife, Jane Caley, on the 16th of October, 1853 in the parish church of Lonan. Thomas is described as a forty-four year old widower and Labourer of the parish of Lonan, the son of John Kinrade, Tailor. Jane Caley is described as a forty year old spinster of the parish of Lonan, the daughter of Patrick Caley, Tailor. Both parties made their mark and the witnesses were James Caley and John Fargher.

The census of 1861 shows Thomas living at Cronk-e-chule, Lonan, aged 64, a mine labourer, with his second wife, Jane, and their son Philip.

Thomas died on the 25th of October, 1885 at Gretch Voar, Lonan. The informant was his son Philip of the same address who stated that his father was aged ninety.

- 2.6.2 Jane Caley (448) was baptized on the 17th of November, 1811, at Lonan, see Volume III, 12.6.5 for details of her parents. In 1851 she was working at the Crescent Academy in Onchan, a girls boarding school. She married Thomas Kinrade on the 16th of October, 1853, at Lonan. She died at Cronk-e-Chule, Lonan, and was buried on the 4th of April, 1871.

## 2.7 The Children of Thomas Kinrade & Jane Caley

- 2.7.1 Philip Kinrade (45) was baptized on the 30th of November, 1856, at Lonan. He married Isabella Clague (see Volume I, 7.10.1) on the 18th of October, 1879 at Kirk Braddan. Both were single, of full age and residing in Douglas. Philip gave his occupation as labourer, but was probably an unemployed lead miner. Isabella was the daughter of Robert Clague (48), a farmer. The witnesses were Eleanor Wade, Fletcher Kinrade and Thomas F. Hutchinson.

The census return of 1881 shows Philip and Isabella living at Gretch Voar House, Lonan with their sons John Robert, aged five years, and William aged one year. Using the census data, John Robert would have been born in 1876, before Philip and Isabella were married. Isabella is known to have had two illegitimate sons before marrying Philip. One of these sons was John Robert Clague born in 1876, and it is assumed that this is the same John Robert listed on the 1881 census return. Philip's age is given as twenty-four (which is consistent with the returns for 1861 and 1871). Isabella's age is given as twenty-six.

Philip Kinrade left the Island with his step-son Alfred Clague to try his luck in the South African gold mines. It has been assumed that this was around 1900, but Philip and Alfred have not been found in the 1891 census so it may have been as early as 1890. A letter dated the 4th of July, 1900 indicates that he was working for the Jumpers G.M. Co (Gold Mining Company). He died in South Africa. prior to 1919. As a miner he had been earning very good money, one suggestion puts his earnings as £15 per day - a considerable sum in those days. At his death, his widow was left in very straightened circumstance. At approximately the same time Alfred became quite wealthy though he does not appear to have helped his widowed mother. A rift developed between Alfred and his mother at this time, see Clague family notes.

Isabella had two sons, Alfred Clague and John Robert Clague prior to her marriage to Philip Kinrade, see 7.10.1.

- 2.8.1 William James Kinrade (29), Jimmy, was born on the 6th of December, 1880. He married Catherine Elizabeth Corkish on the 31st of July, 1918, at the church of St.

George, Douglas, Isle of Man. James died at Douglas on the 6th of March 1941, and was buried at Braddan.

James worked for Babbington's Brewery as a drayman. During a fire at the brewery in March, 1911, James was badly injured while leading a horse from the stables. He spent several months in a hospital at Liverpool. He never fully recovered his health, and was unable to work again as a drayman. Through the brewery he was found a job as a time keeper for the Highways Board at the Quarter Bridge yards.

2.8.2 Sophia Margaret Kinrade (57) was born on the 18th of September, 1881, at Lonan. She married Thomas Curphey (68) sometime in 1912. The children of this marriage were Albert Curphey (70) born 1914; the twins Amy Isabella Curphey (150) and Ivy May Curphey (151) born 1916; and Sophia Elizabeth Curphey (152), born 1920.

2.8.3 Philip Clague Kinrade (55) was born on the 25th of May, 1883 at Gretchvoar. Throughout his life he was known as Harry. He married Mona Edith Kneale on the 17th of February, 1919 at the church of St. George, Douglas. His address at that time is given as 15, Allan Street. Mona's address is given as Allan Street. The witnesses were Thomas Richard Kneale (Mona's brother) and Sophie Margaret Curphey, Philip's mother. Philip would appear to have been still in the Army as he is described as 'Private A.S.C.M.T'. His father, Philip, a miner, is noted as 'deceased'. There were no issue of this marriage. Philip died in 1965 and was buried at Braddan on the 28th of September when his age was recorded as 82 years.

2.8.3.1 Mona Edith Kneale (153) was born in 1882. She married Harry Kinrade on the 17th of February, 1919, at St. George's, Douglas. She survived her husband, dying in 1966, and was buried on the 24th of March at Braddan when her age was recorded as 84 years.

2.8.4 Thomas Patrick Kinrade (56) was born on the 4th of May, 1885, at Lonan. He married Mildred (...) (154) in the early 1900s. The children of this marriage were Philip Kinrade (155) and Norman Kinrade (156). Thomas was a fruiterer, trading with a horse and cart.

2.8.4.1 Philip Kinrade (155) married Louisa Ellen Nobel (306). There was one daughter of this marriage, Barbara Kinrade (308). No other details are available.

2.8.4.2 Norman Kinrade (156) married Sarah (305). There was one daughter of this marriage, Brenda Kinrade (307). No other details are available.

2.8.5 Benjamin Arthur Kinrade (58) was born on the 22nd of December, 1887, at Lonan. He married Eleanor Brooks (301) in the early 1900s. The children of this marriage were Benjamin Kinrade (302), May Kinrade (303) and Amy Kinrade (304). Benjamin Kinrade (58) died during the First World War, i.e. prior to the end of 1918.

2.8.5.1 Benjamin Kinrade (302) married Alice Woods (359). No other details are available.

## 2.9 The Children of James Kinrade and Catherine Corkish

2.9.1 Isabel Agnes Kinrade (17) was born on the 17th of September, 1918 at Douglas, Isle of Man. She married William Lawson (13) on the 9th of August, 1936 at the church of St. George, Douglas, Isle of Man. At that time William was working as an electrician. The newly-weds lived at 39, Allan Street with Isabel's parents. It was here that their son Brian (1) was born. They were able to get their own House at 2, School Road, Onchan, where their first daughter, Ann (2) was born. On the outbreak of war, William volunteered and joined the Royal Engineers. After training he was posted to Kent, and the family followed in 1940, living in the village of Wye. It was during this time that their second daughter, Vivien (3), was born. In 1943/4 the family moved to Welling, firstly to Belvedere Road and secondly to Eastcote Road. In 1945 the family returned to the Isle of Man living, again, at 39, Allan Street, Douglas. She died at 0630 PDT on July 31st, 2007, at Mission, B.C. See Volume II, 3.2 for details of her descendents.

2.9.2 Robert James Kinrade (18) was born on the 20th of September, 1920 at Douglas, Isle of Man. As a young man he was a keen football player. He apprenticed as a joiner/carpenter. At the outbreak of World War II, he volunteered and joined the Royal Artillery. He was captured when the Germans overran Crete and spent the rest of the war in as a prisoner of war. At the end of the war, he returned to the Isle of Man, resuming his trade as a carpenter. He married Kathleen Watterson (22) on the 16th of September, 1947 at the church of St. George, Douglas, Isle of Man. The following year Robert and Kathleen emigrated to Canada, landing on the 1st of May, 1948. They settled in St. Catherine's, Ontario, where the three children of the marriage were born.

Robert worked in the construction industry, running his own business. In September 1968 the family returned to the Isle of Man.

Robert died at 2.15 a.m. on the 29th of January, 2005, at Noble's Hospital, Douglas, Isle of Man.
