

The South

2.1 Description

Rushen Sheading in the south of the Island consists of the parishes of Rushen, Arbory and Malew. Mainly a farming and fishing area, in early times there was some mining, for example at Bradda Head, Port Erin. The main centre of habitation is Castletown with its well preserved medieval castle, Castle Rushen. Castletown was the capital of the South Side division and, after the Island became a single kingdom, the capital of the Island until 1869 when the capital was moved to Douglas. The fishing fleets were centred on Castletown, Port St. Mary and Port Erin. Castle Rushen served as the military headquarters of the Island being garrisoned by an English line regiment. By around 1816 the garrison had been reduced to about half a company and was removed completely in 1896. The castle served as the civil gaol of the Island. In 1886 it was condemned and finally replaced in 1891 by a purpose built facility outside Douglas.

The Abbot of Rushen Abbey was a major landowner in the Island holding some 99 quarterlands or farms and 77 cottages. In connection with these holdings the Abbot had his own courts, the Barony Courts, and prison, located on Peel Island. The English Act of Dissolution did not apply to the Island. The first diversion of church lands to secular purposes occurred in 1537 when Furness Abbey was dissolved and its tithes in Maughold and Michael were leased for the king's benefit. An arbitrary act by Henry VIII in 1540 vested the monastery of Rushen, the priory of Douglas and the friary of Bymaken in the Crown. On St. John the Baptist's Day, 1540, the abbot and his six brethren "were removed" from the monastery and the prioress and her three sisters "departed from the priory of Douglas."

2.2 Background

- 2.2.1 William Lawson (1268) seems to have been the first member of the family to move to the south of the Island. He was born on the 5th of March 1704-5 at Andreas. It is not known when he moved to the south of the Island but he was twenty-nine when he married Mary Kneen (1583) on the 1st of August, 1734, at Arbory. The wills of William and Mary would indicate that there were no issue of the marriage, though

William's will does mention John, the wife's son. Mary died in September, 1740, and William in December of the same year. See 1.8.3 for further details.

2.2.2 Edward Lawson (1584) was the second member of the family to move south. He was born in 1726 at Andreas (baptized on the 8th of September). We don't know when he moved to the south but he married Elinor Skelly on the 28th of July, 1750, at Rushen. See 1.9.1 for further details and 2.3 for his descendants.

2.2.2.1 Elinor Skelly (1588) was probably born in Rushen/Arbory circa 1725. She married Edward Lawson on the 28th of July, 1750, at Rushen. She was buried at Rushen on the 17th of September, 1805. See 2.3 for details of her descendants.

Elinor's parents have been identified as John Skealey (5875) and Joney Kinvig (5876). Although marriage and baptismal records have not been found, the identification has been made using the parent's Wills.

2.2.3 John Lawson (1587), the youngest brother of Edward, was the third member of the family to move to the south. He was baptized on the 28th of September, 1735, at Andreas. John was only nine years old when his father, Edward, died in 1744. Again, as for his brother Edward, we do not know when John moved south, but he married Catherine Taggart on the 6th of July, 1765, at Arbory, see Volume IV, 24.2.3. He was buried on the 20th May, 1791, at Malew. See 2.31 for details of his descendants.

2.3.1 Catherine Lawson (1589) was baptized on the 15th of July, 1749, the illegitimate daughter of Edward and Alice Kearney. She was buried on the 22nd of June, 1751, at Rushen, the victim of smallpox.

2.3.2 Isabella Lawson (1590) was baptized on the 8th of April, 1751, at Rushen. No further details available.

2.3.3 Eleanor Lawson (1591) was baptized on the 17th of December, 1752, at Rushen. She was confirmed in 1770 at Arbory. Eleanor married Henry Steich on the 20th of February, 1773, at Rushen. There were eight children of the marriage, of which four died in infancy and one son died at sea with his father in 1793. See 2.4 for details of her descendants.

2.3.3.1 Henry Steich (1599) was born circa 1750. He married Eleanor Lawson on the 20th of February, 1773, at Rushen. He died at sea on the 12th of August, 1793, see 2.3.11. See 2.4 for details of his descendants.

2.3.4 Anne Lawson (1592) was baptized on the 27th of July, 1755, at Rushen. She was buried on the 8th of March, 1756, at Rushen.

- 2.3.5 Mary Lawson (1593) was baptized on the 2nd of January, 1757, at Rushen. She married John Taylor on the 7th of October, 1780, at Rushen (the marriage seems to have been recorded also at Santan). She was died on the 10th of April, 1813, at Rushen. See 2.5 for details of her descendants.
- 2.3.5.1 John Taylor (1600) was born circa 1755. He married Mary Lawson on the 7th of October, 1780, at Rushen. John was the sole survivor when two fishing boats collided in the dark on the 12th of August, 1793. Two of his brothers-in-law and a nephew died in the accident, see 2.3.11. See 2.5 for details of his descendants.
- 2.3.6 Anne Lawson (1594) was baptized on the 30th of March, 1760, at Rushen. She was buried on the 15th of April, 1765, at Rushen, the victim of smallpox.
- 2.3.7 Edward Lawson (1595) was baptized on the 14th of August, 1763, at Rushen. He married Eleanor Moore on the 9th of December, 1790, at Rushen. He died at sea on the 12th of August, 1793. See 2.8 for details of his descendants.
- 2.3.7.1 Eleanor Moore (1601) was born circa 1765 at Rushen, She married Edward Lawson on the 9th of December, 1790, at Rushen. See 2.8 for details of her descendants.
- 2.3.8 John Lawson (1596) was baptized on the 12th of October, 1766, at Rushen. He married Esther Fargher (see 14.2.2) on the 3rd of February, 1787, at Santan. By 1793 the family had moved to Douglas. He was buried on the 29th of April, 1808. See 2.9 for details of his descendants.
- 2.3.9 William Lawson (1597) was baptized on the 30th of July, 1769, at Rushen. He married Catherine Moore (see Volume I, 13.1.1) on the 30th of December, 1790, at Rushen. By 1795 the family had moved to Douglas. In 1796 William enlisted in The Manx Fencibles when he was described as having "fair complexion, grey eyes and fair hair". See 2.15 for descendant details. A letter for Robert Cally to the family of John Cretch in December 1781 mentions that he, Robert, had served with William in the (fishing) smack owned by Mr. Tumman (? Taubman).
- 2.3.10 Anne Lawson (1598) was baptized on the 18th of July, 1773, at Rushen. She married Thomas Callow on the 9th of August, 1800, at Braddan, see Volume III, 13.1.1. See Volume III, 13.2 for details of her descendants.
- She died before the census of 1841. There is a possible burial a Braddan on the 12th of January, 1832. There is also a Will for that year.
- 2.3.11 On the night of 12th of August, 1793, two fishing boats collided in the dark. Of the fourteen men aboard, only one survived. A memorial in Rushen church names the 13 dead: Henry Watterson & Son; Henry Steich & Son; William Watterson; Edward Miller; William Watterson; Richard Christian; John Maddrell; John Keig; Edward Gell; Edward Lawson; William Gell. The sole survivor was John Taylor.

- 2.4.1 Andrew Steich (2730) was baptized on the 31st of May, 1773. He married Margaret Crebbin on the 8th of December, 1798, at Rushen.
- 2.4.2 Thomas Steich (2731) was baptized on the 27th of August, 1775, at Rushen. He did not survive infancy and was buried at Rushen on the 18th of September, 1775.
- 2.4.3 Margaret Steich (2732) was baptized on the 27th of October, 1776, at Rushen. She did not survive childhood and was buried on the 5th of September, 1781, at Rushen.
- 2.4.4 Catherine Steich (2733) was baptized on the 2nd of April, 1780, at Rushen. She did not survive childhood and was buried on the 10th of January, 1781, at Rushen.
- 2.4.5 Margaret Steich (2734) was baptized on the 13th of December, 1781, at Rushen. No further details are available.
- 2.4.6 Thomas Steich (2735) was baptized on the 25th of February, 1784, at Rushen. He drowned with his father in a fishing boat accident on the 12th of August, 1793. See 2.3.11 above.
- 2.4.7 Ann Steich (2736) was baptized on the 1st of September, 1786, at Rushen. No further details are available.
- 2.4.8 Catherine Steich (2737) was baptized on the 1st of September, 1786, at Rushen. She did not survive infancy and was buried on the 31st of October, 1786, at Rushen.

- 2.5.1 John Taylor (1608) was baptized on the 1st of October, 1781, at Rushen. He was buried on the 13th of April, 1797.
- 2.5.2 Ann Taylor (1609) was baptized on the 9th of February, 1783, at Rushen. No further details available.

- 2.5.3 William Taylor (1610) was baptized on the 29th of April, 1787, at Rushen. There is a burial for William aged 57 years of Port Iron on the 26th of May, 1857, at Rushen.
- 2.5.4 Henry Taylor (1611) was baptized on the 13th of December, 1789, at Rushen. He did not survive infancy and was buried on 21st of January, 1791, at Rushen.
- 2.5.5 Henry Taylor (275) was baptized on the 13th of May, 1792, at Rushen. He married Elizabeth Corkish on the 19th of June, 1823, at Rushen, see Volume IV, 1.9.9. He was buried on the 24th of July, 1838, aged 45 years. See 2.6 for details of his descendants.
- 2.5.6 Edward Taylor (1613) was baptized on the 9th of November, 1794, at Rushen.
- 2.5.7 Richard Taylor (1614) was baptized on the 29th of June, 1797, at Rushen. He was buried on the 9th of October, 1797, at Rushen.
- 2.5.8 Margaret Taylor (1615) was baptized on the 1st of December, 1798, at Rushen.

- 2.6.1 Edward Corkish (5453) was baptized on the 1st of January, 1819, at Rushen. He may have been known as Taylor in later life but has not been identified under either name in the 1841 or later census.
- 2.6.2 Richard Taylor (2100) was baptized on the 6th of July, 1823, at Rushen. A fisherman, he has not been found in the 1841 census (at sea?). He married Jane Waterson on the 13th of November, 1844, at Rushen. In 1851 he and his family were living in Rushen. In 1861 the family were living at Bradda, Rushen. In 1871 the family were living at Four Roads, Rushen, though Richard was on the fishing boat "Dolphin" on census night. In 1881 the family were living at Bradda. He was buried on the 26th of July, 1882, at Rushen, when his age was given as fifty-nine years and eleven months. See 2.7 for details of his descendants.
- 2.6.2.1 Jane Watterson (2104) was baptized on the 14th of September, 1823, at Rushen, the daughter of William Waterson & Ann Millar. She married Richard Taylor on the 13th of November, 1844, at Rushen. Her widowed mother was living with the family in 1851. In 1891, a widow, she was living with her unmarried, youngest daughter, Elizabeth, at Braddan. She was buried at Rushen on the 5th of March, 1909, when her age was given as eighty-five years. See 8.6 for details of her family and 2.7 for details of her descendants.
- 2.6.3 John Taylor (5454) was baptized on the 9th of July, 1826, at Rushen. He has not been identified in the 1841 census.

- 2.7.1 Catherine Taylor (2105) was baptized on the 23rd of September, 1845, at Rushen. In 1851 she was living with her parents. In 1861 she was employed as a dressmaker and living with her parents at Bradda. In 1871 she was living, unmarried, with her parents at Four Road, though no occupation is listed. She has not been identified in the 1881 census.
- 2.7.2 Ann Taylor (2106) was baptized on the 1st of October, 1848, at Rushen. In 1851 she was living with her parents at the census but died of smallpox later that year. She was buried on the 29th of September, 1851, at Rushen.
- 2.7.3 Richard Taylor (2107) was baptized on the 5th of October, 1851, at Rushen. He died of smallpox aged two weeks and was buried at Rushen on the 10th of October, 1851.
- 2.7.4 Richard Taylor (2108) was baptized on the 31st of March, 1853, at Rushen. In 1861 he was living with his parents at Bradda.
- 2.7.5 Ann Taylor (2109) was baptized on the 24th of January, 1856, at Rushen. In 1861 she was living with her parents at Bradda. In 1871 she was living with her parents at Four Roads. Not identified in 1881 census.
- 2.7.6 William Taylor (2110) was baptized on the 3rd of October, 1858, at Rushen. In 1861 he was living with his parents at Bradda. In 1871 he was living with his parents at Four Roads. He was buried at Rushen on the 22nd of May, 1872, when his age was recorded as 13 years.
- 2.7.7 Jane Taylor (2111) was baptized on the 25th of August, 1861, at Rushen. In 1871 she was living with her parents at Four Roads. She has not been identified in 1881 census.
- 2.7.8 Elizabeth Margaret Taylor (2112) was baptized on the 24th of September, 1865, at Rushen. In 1871 she was living with her parents at Four Roads. In 1881 she was living with parents at Bradda. In 1891 she was employed as a dressmaker and living with her widowed mother at Bradda.

2.8.1 Thomas Lawson (1616) was baptized on the 25th of September, 1791, at Rushen. He married Catherine Kermode on the 14th of May, 1818, at Rushen. There were no issue of the marriage. In 1835 Thomas was listed as one of the Churchwardens at Rushen. The 1841 census shows his faming at Port Iron (Erin). In 1851 he is listed as a freehold farmer of 9 acres at Droughedfail, Rushen. He was buried on the 17th of April, 1855, at Rushen.

2.8.1.1 Catherine Kermode (1618) was born circa 1790 at Rushen. She married Thomas Lawson on the 14th of May, 1818, at Rushen. There were no issue of the marriage. She was buried on the 23rd of July, 1857, at Rushen, when her age was given as sixty-seven years.

2.8.1.1.1 Catherine Kermode, a niece born circa 1823, was brought up by the couple. She married John Moore on the 2nd of May, 1859, at Rushen. In 1861 she and her family were living at Dragad Fell, Rushen.

2.8.1.1.2 Thirza Callister was baptised on the 20th of January, 1843, at Rushen under the name Kermode, the illegitimate daughter of Catherine. In 1851 she was living with her mother and grand-parents at Droughedfail, Rushen. In 1861 she was living with her mother and step-father at Dragad Fell, Rushen. She married John Gale on the 28th of November, 1869, at Rushen.

2.8.2 Edward Lawson (1617) was baptized on the 18th of August, 1793, at Rushen. He married Isabella Bridson on the 23rd of February, 1815, at Malew. Edward died before the census of 1851 when Isabella is listed as "widow, aged 63".

Although their six children were all born at Castletown, the family seems to have moved to Liverpool before 1841, See 6.3 for details of his descendants.

2.8.2.1 Isabella Bridson (1619) was born circa 1795 at Rushen. She married Edward Lawson on the 23d of February, 1815, at Malew. See 6.3 for details of her descendants.

In 1830 she inherited from her aunt, Ann Bridson, a house in Gough Court, Parliament Street, in the parish of Upper Harington in the Park, Liverpool. Isabella was to enjoy the rents and proceeds from the premises during her lifetime after which the property was to be sold and the proceeds divided among her children. The property was not to be encumbered by any debts of Edward. She was also the residual legatee to inherit in her own right and was to be free from any debts incurred by Edward.

- 2.9.1 John Lawson (1635) was baptized on the 24th of January, 1787, at Santan. In 1794 he received "my best coat" by the Will of his grand-father, William Faragher.
- 2.9.2 Jane Lawson (1636) was baptized on the 5th of July, 1789, at St. George, Douglas. She married John Kewley on the 13th of September, 1812, at Braddan, see 15.16.1. In 1851 Jane is a widow living at 6, Bigwell Street, Douglas, with her son John, aged 21, a roper. Her daughter Elizabeth and her family were also living at the same address. See 15.17 for details of her descendants.
- 2.9.3 James Lawson (1637) was baptized on the 22nd of January, 1792, at St. George, Douglas. He married Elizabeth Curry on the 25th of November, 1815, at Malew. James was a mariner. He was buried on the 21st of May, 1873, at Malew when his age was recorded as 83 years. See 2.10 for details of his descendants.
- 2.9.3.1 Elizabeth Curry (1643) was baptized on the 10th of August, 1788, at Malew, the daughter of Thomas Curry and Isabel Creer (1647). She married James Lawson on the 25th of November, 1815, at Malew. See 2.10 for details of her descendants.
- She is not mentioned in her husbands Will and so is presumed to have pre-deceased him. There is a possible burial at Arbory on the 22nd of February, 1872, when the recorded age is 82 years.
- 2.9.3.1.1 Thomas Curry (1646) was born circa 1750. Possibly the son of Edward & Jane. He married Isabel Creer on the 5th of December, 1772, at Malew. He was buried at Malew on the 13th of January, 1812.
- His Will, proved 3rd June, 1812, at Castletown, states that he died on the 12th of January and appoints Isabella als Creer as his sole Executrix. No mention is made of any children.
- Recorded baptisms (all at Malew) include:- William, 24th August, 1773; Jane 7th July, 1776; Jane 14th March, 1779, buried 14th July, 1779; Margaret 14th March, 1779, Thomas 11th of November, 1781; John 5th June, 1785; and Elizabeth, above, 17th of August, 1788.
- 2.9.3.1.2 Isabella Creer (1647) was born circa 1750. She married Thomas Curry on the 5th of December, 1772, at Malew. Possibly died of smallpox and buried at Malew on the 24th of October, 1837.
- 2.9.4 William Lawson (1638) was baptized on the 5th of October, 1794, at St. George, Douglas.
- 2.9.5 Esther Lawson (1639) was baptized on the 18th of March, 1798, at St. George, Douglas. She was buried on the 21st of June, 1799, at St. George.
- 2.9.6 Richard Lawson (1640) was baptized on the 27th of September, 1801, at St. George, Douglas. He married firstly Elizabeth Cain on the 15th of December, 1817, at Malew, and secondly Margaret Quayle on the 7th of June, 1823, at Marown, see Volume IV, 21.10.1. See 2.13 and 2.14 for details of his descendants. He and his family have not been found in the 1841 census.
- 2.9.6.1 Elizabeth Cain (1645) was born circa 1800. She married Richard Lawson on the 13th of December, 1817, at Malew. See 2.13 for details of her descendants.
- 2.9.7 Esther Lawson (1641) was born in 1804. She appear to have spent her adult life as a domestic servant in Douglas. At the 1841 census we find her living in Athol Street at the home of Philip Elliot, a surgeon from England, and his wife Elenor. In 1851 she was living at 12, Great Nelson Street, the housekeeper to Joseph Brown, a

young chemist from England. In 1861 we find her at 14, Water Street, keeping house for Edward Kneale, a draper, and the several young men, apprentices and assistants, that live with him. She died without issue and was buried on the 27th of April, 1867, at St. George, Douglas. [Will]

2.10.1 Jane Lawson (1661) was baptized on the 25th of June, 1817, at Malew. She married Patrick Mc Lusky on the 30th of November, 1839, at Malew. In 1871, a widow, she was living at North Abbey, Malew, when she was employed as a washerwoman. Her grand-daughter, Jenetta Jones aged 10, was living with her. She was left one shilling in her father's Will of 1873. She has not been found in the 1881 census. There is a possible burial at Braddan on the 2nd of May, 1873, when the age was recorded as 53 years. See 2.11 for details of her descendants.

2.10.1.1 Patrick Mc Lusky (1667) was born circa 1813, in Ireland. He married Jane Lawson on the 30th of November, 1839, at Malew. Patrick died before the census of 1871. See 2.11 for details of his descendants.

In 1841 the family were living at Ballasalla, Malew. Patrick was recorded as Edward and he was employed as an agricultural labourer. In 1851, a labourer, he and his family were living in Castletown Road, Malew. The family have not been found in the 1861 census.

2.10.3.1 John Fargher (1668) was baptied on the 28th of December, 1821, at Santan, the son of John Fargher & Jane Gick. He married Elizabeth Lawson on the 27th of March, 1845, at Malew. In 1851 he was living in Santan with his wife and children Henry and Elizabeth. He was a publican, agricultural labourer and shoemaker. He was buried at Santan on the 24th of June, 1901, when his age was recorded as 79 years. See 2.12 for details of his descendants.

2.10.4 James Lawson (1664) was baptized on the 8th of August, 1824, at Malew. He was buried on the 10th of December, 1828, at Malew.

- 2.10.6.1 Mary ... (1669) was born circa 1835, probably in Malew. She married James Lawson circa 1859. She died before 1870. None of these events have been positively identified. See 6.52 for details of her descendants.
- 2.10.6.2 Mary Brown (1670) was born in 1841 at Ormskirk, Lancashire She married firstly Thomas Whitworth, by whom she had one son, Thomas born 1864, and secondly James Lawson on the 5th of September, 1870, at Malew. See 6.57 for details of her descendants.
- 2.10.6.3 Thomas Whitworth/Lawson was born circa 1863 in Liverpool. In 1861 he was living with his mother and step-father at 24, Illiad Street, Everton, when he was described as a step-son. In 1881 he was living with his mother and step-father at 38A, Illiad Street, Everton, when his name was given as Thoms H Lawson and he was described as a son. He was employed as a labourer.

- 2.15.1 John Lawson (1695) was baptized on the 21st of August, 1791, at Rushen. He married Elizabeth Gick on the 5th of October, 1815, at Malew. He was buried on the 14th of March, 1860, at Arbory although his gravestone indicates that he died on the 5th of May, 1860, aged 69 years. See 2.16 for descendant details.

In 1841 he was farming at Oatlands, Santan. In 1851 he was farming 21 acres at Ballacomish, Arbory, and employing 1 labourer.

In 1851 Ann Lawson, a widow aged 40, was visiting with the family. She has not yet been identified. Her birth place was recorded as Castletown. 2.16.1 Edward Lawson (1703) was baptized on the 28th of January, 1816, at Braddan. He married firstly Elizabeth Corlett on the 11th of November, 1837, at Santan, see 2.17 for descendant details, and secondly Margaret Moore (see 13.6.1) on the 13th of October, 1845, at Arbory, see 2.20 for descendant details. He was buried at Arbory on the 25th of May, 1886, when his age was recorded as 70 years.

In 1841 he was employed as an agricultural labourer and was living with his first wife and family at Oatlands, Santan. By 1851 he had moved to Castletown and was working as a labourer. He and his second wife and family were living at 4, Quay Street. In 1861 the family were living in Malew Road, Arbory, where Edward was farming 45 acres. In 1871 the address was given as Ballavarkish and he was farming 61 acres. the 1881 census gives the address as Grenaby Road and the size of the farm as 65 acres.

2.16.1.1 Elizabeth Corlett (1712) was born circa 1814. She married Edward Lawson on the 11th of November, 1837, at Santan. She was buried at Santan on the 3rd April, 1844, when her age was recorded as 30 years. See 2.17 for details of her descendants.

2.16.2 Catherine Lawson (1704) was baptized on the 1st of March, 1818, at Santan. She had an illegitimate daughter, Catherine Jane Lawson/Kinrade by Daniel Kinrade in 1845.

At the census of 1841 she was working in the Inn of her uncle, Edward Gick. In 1851 she was visiting with Thomas & Eleanor Gick at Old Road, Santan, when she was employed as an house servant. She has not been identified in the 1861 census.

2.16.3 Elizabeth Lawson (1705) was baptized on the 18th of March, 1821, at Santan. She married Thomas Comish (1714) on the 13th of December, 1845, at Arbory. She was buried on the 2nd of January, 1879, at Arbory when her age was recorded as 57 years.

At the census of 1841 she was working in the Inn of her uncle, Edward Gick.

2.16.3.1 Thomas Comaish (1714) was born in Arbory circa 1824. He married firstly Elizabeth Lawson on the 13th of Decmber, 1845, at Arbory and secondly Eleanor Lawson. He was buried at Arbory on the 5th of June, 1905, when his age was recorded as 81 years. There were no issue of either marriage.

2.16.5 John Lawson (1707) was baptized with his twin sister on the 6th of January, 1826, at Santan. He was buried on the 21st of August, 1853, at Arbory where his gravestone indicates that he died on 19th of August aged 27 years. At the time of his death he was unmarried. He had been living with his parents and working on their farm.

2.16.6 Margaret Lawson (1708) was baptized with her twin brother on the 6th of January, 1826, at Santan. She has not been identified in the 1851 census. A memorial inscription at Arbory states that she died on the 20th of April, 1867, aged 40 years.

2.16.7 Ellinor Lawson (1709) was baptized on the 1st of March, 1829, at Santan. She married Thomas Comaish on the 8th of July, 1879, at Braddan, see 2.16.3.1 above..

His first marriage was to Eleanor Caine on the 11th of December, 1856, at Arbory. Baptisms for seven children of this union have been found, see 2.22. Eleanor was buried at Malew on the 18th of July, 1870. A year later William married Catherine Wright on the 19th of August, 1871, at Malew. It is now that things get a little murkey.

The 1871 census shows William, a widower, living at Cross Four Ways with three of his unmarried children. In 1881 he was living at Biltown, Malew, with his wife and five children. The two oldest children are identified with his first marriage to Eleanor. These are followed by two young children whose baptisms identify their mother as Catherine Teare. The final child is a year older than the two younges. The baptism of this William, 8, is identified with Catherine Wright.

A possible explanation is that Catherine Wright died, probably as a result of complications following childbirth, and William married a third time to Catherine Teare towards the end of 1880 or early in 1881. One problem is that no suitable burial for a Catherine Lawson has been found nor has a marriage record for a Catherine Teare. However it does explain another problem. It had been assumed that the wife Catherine listed in the 1881 census was Catherine Wright which would place her birth date as circa 1842 and place as Ballaugh. No such person has been found either in the baptismal records or in earlier censuses. However there are several candidates for Catherine Teare.

In 1841 he was living with his parents at Oatlands, Santan. In 1851 he was living with his parents at Ballacomish, Arbory, when he was apprenticed as a shoemaker. In 1861 he and his family were living at Ballavarkish, Arbory. At this time he was employed as a shoemaker. In 1871 he was living at Cross Four Ways, Malew, a widower, employed in the quarries. In 1881 the family were living in a cottage at Biltown, Malew. In 1891 he and his family were living at Cross Four Roads, Malew, where he was employed in the quarries.

In 1871 John and Patience were farming 35 acres in Arbory. It seems that at some time he took up the trade of butcher, possibly as a side line on the farm, for in 1881 Patience is listed as a butcher's widow. He died in Liverpool and is buried at Arbory where his gravestone indicates that he died on the 14th of April, 1875, though his age is given as 30 years. His son, Benjamin, is buried with him.

2.33.1 Thomas Lawson (1176) was baptized on the 8th of June, 1800, at Malew. No further details available.

2.33.2 John Benjamin Lawson (1177) was baptized on the 23rd of January, 1803, at Malew. He married firstly Mary [Stanley] on the 29th of October, 1837, at Holy Trinity, Liverpool, and secondly Catherine Hudson on the 30th of September, 1849, at Malew. He was buried at Malew on the 9th of October, 1851, when his age was recorded as 49 years. See 2.34 for details of his descendants.

He has not been found in the 1841 census (? at sea). The 1851 census gives his age as 50 years and his occupation as mariner.

2.33.2.1 Mary Stanley was born circa 1803 at Liverpool. She married John Lawson on the 29th of October, 1837, at Holy Trinity, Liverpool. At the present time it had not been verified that this marriage reflects the parents of Catherine, see 2.34.1 below.

2.33.2.2 Catherine Hudson (1823) was born circa 1803. She married firstly John Lawson on the 30th of September, 1849, at Malew and secondly John Hudgeon on the 20th of September, 1853, at Malew.

In 1851 she was living with her husband and step-children at 1, Quay Street, Castletown. She has not been identified in the 1861 census.

2.33.3 Ann Lawson (1178) was baptized on the 1st of December, 1805, at Malew. She married Joseph Brittain on the 29th of May, 1826, at Malew. It appears that they left the Island shortly after the marriage for no Brittain family has been found in the 1851 census.

2.33.4 William Lawson (1179) was baptized on the 10th of September, 1809, at Malew. A mariner, he married Anne Radcliffe on the 19th of November, 1829, at Malew. In 1841 the family were living in Port St. Mary. He was at sea on census night 1851. He died before 1861. See 2.35 for details of his descendants.

2.33.4.1 Ann Radcliffe (1644) was born in 1797 at Arbory. She married William Lawson on the 19th of November, 1829, at Malew. In 1851 she was living in Port St. Mary. William was at sea and a niece, Jane Gelling, was living with her. In 1861 she was a widow living in Malew. See 2.35 for details of her descendants.

Jane Gelling was baptized on the 6th of June, 1841, at Rushen, the daughter of William Gelling & Jane Radcliffe. She did not survive childhood and was buried at Rushen on the 7th of July, 1851, when her age was recorded as 10 years.

2.33.5 James Grimer Lawson (1180) was baptized on the 1st of January, 1814, at Malew. No further details available.

2.33.6 George Lawson (1181) was baptized on the 14th of May, 1815, at Malew. No further details available.

2.33.7 Robert Christian Lawson (1182) was baptized on the 19th of September, 1819, at Malew. No further details available.

2.37.3 John James Fitzsimmons (5802) was baptized on the 27th of July, 1862, at Malew. Only his mother's name was recorded at his baptism but he subsequently went by the name Lawson.
